The Caraway city FEMA flood maps will be reviewed to see if there are changes in the city's status. The last flood maps were evaluated in 1969.

A low bid of \$126,800.00 was accepted from Utility Services Co.,INC. of West Memphis to provide maintenance and painting on the city water tower. The city received a grant for \$183,000.00 to pay for this work. The start of this work is expected to be soon.

March 18th is the date for the signing of the paper work to start the new well work.

Travis Emery addressed the council concerning the recent purchase of the Caraway Hardware building for the purpose of putting in a chemical/seed business. The owner is Wade Castleberry.

Park Commissioner Clay informed the council of the lack of sign ups for the baseball & softball program. He also said plans would be made for movies in the park, Easter egg hunt and a fishing rodeo this spring. Plans are being made to apply for a grant to buy new playground equipment. The possibility of moving some he playground equipment behind the ball park to the main park area.
